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#### Pastor's Report 2008

**P** — Partner in the gospel ministry of First Baptist Church. The first preaching series I did here was on the book of Philippians. In chapter 1 verse 5 Paul describes his relationship with the Philippians as a partnership. I feel that way with you. It is a privilege to partner with you in so many excellent ministries.

*Preaching*. This past year I preached a series on the names of Jesus and names of God. I also began a series in the book of Hebrews. In 2009 we will finish the book of Hebrews right before Easter and then I hope to preach through the book of Ecclesiastes and subsequently will do a series this summer on the names of the Holy Spirit. In the fall I hope to launch a series on the Book of Acts. I love preaching. An ideal week for me is to accomplish a significant part of the study for the sermon on Monday and then allow the passage to percolate in my heart throughout the week.

- **A** Administration. You have graciously surrounded me with a team of capable administrative help. Jennifer Sortore keeps the church office running and always with a smile. Jennifer Lavrey not only does an excellent job administratively with the music/worship, she also is an accomplished participant. A church is an organism consisting of vital relationships but it is also an organization which needs capable administration. Janice Snyder as our church treasurer does an invaluable job.
- **S** *Shepherd*. It is my privilege to be a member of a council of elders. While I am the visible one, often we truly have a shared pastoral ministry. If this fellowship depended on me alone to do all the shepherding, we would be anemic. Visitation, counseling, and discipleship are the formal aspects of shepherding, friendship is the informal aspect. We truly are a church where everyone is a minister.
- T Teaching. For the past 4½ years I have been teaching a curriculum called Bible Training Centre for Pastors/Leaders. This curriculum was developed for training pastors in developing countries. A group of four participants have been faithful in their attendance for nine modules and we are planning to complete the tenth module this spring. The course is designed to be taught in a progression where one class is the prerequisite for the next. I'm not sure if I will start the process over again, but I will definitely have a ministry training opportunity next fall. I also enjoy teaching Sunday School. This fall I taught a new members class. This next spring I will be teaching a class called "Soul Talk." It's about having relationships with others that encourage spiritual growth.
- O Outreach. My primary outreach vehicle has been involvement at Franklinville Central School. I coach, substitute teach, and am a member of the TBA Foundation. My school ministry is not only a perfect fit using my past training in education, it also gives me great joys and challenges. I'm glad I get to do life with those who are outside "the holy huddle."

**R** – *Relationships*. I consider relationships to be my top priority. Of first and foremost priority is my relationship with the LORD. My spiritual life is not professional; it is personal. This next year I plan to read the Bible chronologically using a reading schedule I found on the Internet. Due to my Attention Deficit Disorder I read a variety of spiritual books as well as my Bible. I attended an excellent conference in Colorado in August called *The School of Spiritual Direction* and I hope to attend Part II in August 2009.

Second to the LORD is my wife. Molly and I are enjoying the partially empty nest. Our growing children bring us great joy and still keep us on our knees; that will never change. I try to have lunch with my boys once a week at Houghton. We enjoy spending our Sunday afternoons and evenings as a family. Being near my mother was one of the reasons why we moved back to New York State ten years ago. We so enjoy being near her and having her participate in this fellowship.

*Rest*. I try to take Sunday afternoons and evenings off as my Sabbath. It has become an essential time to be together as a family. Ryan and Christie and Jonathan will not always be near us, so these days are especially meaningful.

It is hard for me to believe that I have been at FBC for ten years. It has been said that a pastor/church relationship is a lot like a marriage. If that is true, I am happily married. It has also been said that churches and pastors develop the same personality. The longer we hang out together the more I become like you and you become like me. For my part, that's a good thing.

Thanks for allowing me to be a pastor at First Baptist Church in Franklinville. I look forward to what the LORD has in store for us together in 2009.

#### Report from the Council of Elders 2008

**Education** – As a council we are continuing to study the book, *Biblical Eldership*, by Alexander Strauch. We typically cover several pages each week and have good discussion. The purpose of our study is to learn more about being biblical elders.

We learned some invaluable lessons about accountability, mentoring, and authority. The decision to have a youth ministry led by parents is the right approach for our church and community.

**Direction** – Adding on to our current facility has been a topic of discussion. Various options have been explored and lots of dreaming and constructive criticisms have been offered. A committee has been formed to explore the next steps in our desire to expand our facility with the goal of enhancing our ministry.

**Encouragement** – Some of the greatest moments we have had as an elder council is spending time with members of the flock listening and offering counsel. This has taken place as an entire council or as a small group. Our council has great wisdom in the collaboration of our walks with God. We consider ourselves privileged to be asked to join a brother or sister in their spiritual journey.

**Relationships** – As individual elders we meet outside of our weekly meetings. We minister together, pray together, and just share life together. In a very real sense the health of a church is in direct proportion to the relational health of the leadership.

**Shepherding** — We spend time each week at our meetings praying for the flock and the concerns we are aware of. We have been called upon to anoint with oil those who are led by the Lord to do so. Elders visit the flock on a regular basis and we desire to expand our visitation ministry more in the coming year. As elders we are involved in just about every aspect of the family life of our flock. Formally or informally, all of the elders are involved in some type of teaching ministry. The picture of a biblical shepherd watching over his flock is a picture we desire to emulate here at FBC.

The Board provided Sunday school teachers, curriculum and supplies for students age 2 through adults. Rainbow Club, led by Cindy Schwedt, met throughout the year. Seekers, led by Pauline Fox, met in the spring, but has not been able to meet all fall, due to the lack of an available helper. Various Bible Study groups have met throughout the year, along with Youth Group, led by Peter Wheatley and Joey & Carol Farrand in the spring and led by Joey and Carol and Shane & Anne Krotje in the fall. The Board also provides Jr. Church for children age 4 through 3<sup>rd</sup> grade during the Sunday morning worship service. Jr. Church is attended by over 20 children on most Sundays.

Since our fall Sunday school offerings were being designated to help our local volunteer fire department, we had a fire truck visit. The kids had a great time exploring the truck. #### **TRUSTEE'S REPORT 2008**

"The Trustees shall hold in trust all property of the church and shall be responsible for the upkeep and management of the same." The Trustees, along with help from the Lord, have been active this year doing many little things and some major projects. Toilets in both the men's and women's restrooms were fixed. A support railing was donated and installed in the women's restroom. The baseboard heater in the nursery was fixed. Ceiling holes along with exposed wiring, located in the fellowship hall, was a major obstacle to overcome, but with design help from church members, the problem was resolved. Annual spring parking lot repair was done.

Thanks to Ed Griffin, code required emergency lights were installed in the sanctuary and fellowship hall areas. Said lights consisted of five emergency lights and three emergency exit lights. Six fire extinguishers were recharged during the spring and signs showing their locations were placed in position.

Trustees had two productive work days during the year. One work day was during the summer and the second was during the fall. Along with Trustees and volunteer help from the church, many fix-up projects were accomplished. Those projects were as follows: fixed roof leak of rental house located on Franklin Street. Fixed kitchen and bathroom windows to open property at same location, minor fixes, Pete's office, new roofing installed dover Main Street foyer entrance along with new gutter installed for the foyer. All church hand rails ere tightened and secured. Parking and handicap signs were reworked. Timer light for front sign was put into working order. Touch up painting of the outside of the church along with painting the windows was accomplished. The book slot to the library door was fixed. Many of the sanctuary pews were found to be loose and were tightened.

This fall our furnace, which services the fellowship hall, quit working and consequently had to be repaired. At the same time it was determined that the thermostat located in the fellowship hall was also out of order. It was decided by all concerned to replace the computerized thermostat with a less complicated and as efficient, digital thermostat.

There are many Trustee projects lined up for 2009. One of the major projects which is currently under way is new doors for the front entrance. The ongoing heating problem in the library will be resolved. Ceiling fans in the sanctuary will be repaired. Due to light bulbs for overhead lights in sanctuary being hard to find, new lighting is being considered. Also painting of the sanctuary and new carpet for the sanctuary is being considered. Lots of prayers are needed.

As usual Mit and Barb Farrington are doing an excellent job of taking care of both inside and outside of the church, plus they keep the Trustees aware of repairs that need to be done. Please be sure and thank them for all of their work.

A new push mower and vacuum cleaner were purchased during the year.

Seamless gutters did not get installed as planned due to problems getting contractors to do the work. With the Lord's help the church will find a way to get them installed.

This has been a good year. As a church, we look forward to 2009 to conduct the work of the Lord in an effective and efficient manner.
