Pastor's Report

This is the completion of my 18th year as pastor of First Baptist Church. It has been a great privilege to live and work among the folks of FBC and the Franklinville community-at-large.

Preaching – This year I finished up working through 1 Samuel and then had an Easter Series entitled Pointing to Christ. I used Psalm 22 and the Luke account of the crucifixion and resurrection. In April I began a series through 1 Corinthians. In the summer camp weeks I did a survey through then gospel of John. We were studying John at Camp and so I decided to bring the church along on our journey. In August we began the Corinthians series again. For the Christmas series, The Seven Questions of Christmas, we looked at the Christmas story through the categories of Spiritual Theology (Who is God, What's He up to, Who is Man, What's gone wrong, What's God done to solve the problem, What's the Spirit doing today, and How do we join in the rhythm of what God is doing?). For 2017 we will begin again in the book of 1 Corinthians 6.

Teaching - I have been teaching the middle school Sunday school class for the past two years. I really enjoy this age group. Last year we worked on learning the Lord's Prayer and all the books of the Old Testament. We also studied the book of James and learned about prayer. This year we are learning the Apostle's Creed and the books of the New Testament. I also lead two small groups: 1) A Bible reading group. We read a chapter a day and meet every two weeks and discuss what we have read; 2) I am also working with a group of parents and teens and we are studying the "Seven Questions of Spiritual Theology."

I meet regularly with a couple of men in the fellowship every week. We do Bible study and pray together—a very rewarding time for me.

I continue to substitute teach at Franklinville Central School. This past fall it averaged out to be three times each month. I keep it to a maximum of once a week or four times in a month. I enjoy the interaction with the students, faculty, staff, and administration. I hope I am a light to a dark world.

I continue to coach at FCS. This past year I coached varsity cross country and modified girls and boys basketball. This gives me extended contact with the students and their parents. I have been coaching for 17 years.

I am now the senior pastor in the village. I have been in Franklinville longer than any of the other pastors. This grants me the privilege of doing funerals for folks who don't have a church or don't have a pastor at their church. I consider it a great privilege to serve the community in this way. I'm very grateful to share the gospel at these solemn occasions.

I also continue to be significantly involved at Camp JYC. I am on the lawn maintenance crew, mowing at least once a week. This takes about four hours from start to finish. I also am the pool man. I clean the pool, maintain the chemicals, and oversee the use of the pool. This takes about two-plus hours a day to keep the pool up and running properly. Reports have to be filed and certifications have to be kept up. I also have to maintain my Water Safety Instructor certification and this is due this year. I teach a swim class at FCS and then turn in my report to the Red Cross who then sends my certification to Catt. County. This takes 15-20 hours of time to teach the course and file the paperwork. The county now requires another course for me to take and so before May I will be completing another certification that will also have to be renewed every other year.

I am grateful to be a part of our elder team. I am grateful for all the leaders at FBC who keep so much going in the right direction. I am grateful for the legacy of FBC and JYC and hope God continues to lead us and bless in the years ahead.

Church services were held as follows:

Jan – June; Sept – Dec – Sunday School @ 9:30 am; Worship @ 10:45 am July & August – No Sunday School, Worship @ 9:45 am

Communion was served the first Sunday of each month. Pete Spear continued to lead a Bible reading group, "Journey". A new Parent/Teen Bible Study was started in September, led by Pete. The Trustees, Christian Education Board, Capital Improvement Committee, Camp Committee and Missions Committee met as necessary throughout the year. The Elders' met on Sunday mornings at 8am. Al Fish coordinated Men's Breakfasts at various times throughout the year. Pat Wright and Donna Frederick continued the Shut-in Ministry by bringing iPods or CDs, a bulletin from the worship service, and a "Home Touch Newsletter" to the shut-ins.

January – The year started with the Capital Improvement fund at \$6,413. The Annual Meeting and fellowship dinner was on the 24th.

February – The Valentine's Banquet, "Would You Be Mine?" was on the 6th, with 25 people attending. The Dessert Auction was on the 20th and over \$1,900 was raised for camp. There was a Community Lenten Soup Dinner on the 17th at the CMA Church.

March – Our Maundy Thursday Service was held on the 24th and our Good Friday Service was on the 25th. The Son Rise Service was held at 6:30am on Easter Sunday, the 27th, in Park Square.

April – The Chicken BBQ to benefit Camp JYC was on the 9th. \$774.61 was raised to benefit Camp JYC. The Camp Committee ran the pizza booth at the Maple Festival, making over \$1,700 for Camp while advertising to potential new campers. Some of the Camp staff and campers also participated in the parade, riding in the new large hay wagon with a banner advertising for Camp.

May – There were Camp Work Days held on the 7th and 21st. A "Guys Tool Shower" for Darren Wood was held on the 7th. There was a Mother's Day Breakfast in the Fellowship Hall during the Sunday School hour on the 8th.

June – Camp Work Days were held every Saturday through June, with the exception of the 4th. A congregational meeting was held on the 12th to provide more information about the next step of the new addition. A special love offering was taken for Bright Alternatives throughout the month, ending on the 19th, totaling \$335.55.

July – Camp Dedication Sunday was held on the 10th at FBC, which included a time of prayer and special offering for Camp. We had a great camping season, starting on the 6th and ending on the 29th, directed by Martin and Cassie Hatch. Church was held at Camp for Camp Celebration Sunday on the 31st with a lunch to follow. Staff Doins' was held on the 30th at Camp JYC.

Aug - Nothing notable to report.

September – The Sunday School kick-off coffee hour was on the 11th, a combined Sunday school class was on the 18th, and regular classes began on the 25th. A new Bible study led by Pete was started this month for parents and teens. The Austins, a visiting missionary family, spoke in church on the 11th. There was a Camp Workday on the 24th.

October – The "Almost Annual" FBC Road Rally was held on the 1st, combined with our friends from the Free Methodist Church. There was another Camp Work Day on the 8th. There was a Ladies Fellowship Night on the 13th, where care packages were packed for our college students. On the 30th, the Edwards family, another visiting missionary family, spoke to a combined Sunday School class and shared again during church.

November – A baby shower for Samantha (Kopp) Kuhn was held on the 13th after church. Shoeboxes were collected for Operation Christmas Child on the 13th as well. Our annual Harvest Dinner was held after worship on the 20th.

December – The Finance Committee Meeting was on the 14th. The Howell family hosted an Open House at their home on the 18th for JYC Staff and Counselors. The children's Christmas play, A Dramatic Reading of Luke Chapter 2 and Matthew Chapters 1 and 2, was on the 18th at 7pm, directed by Cassie Hatch and accompanied by Molly Spear. A "Happy Birthday Jesus" party followed in the Fellowship Hall. The Christmas Eve Candlelight Service was on the 24th at 7pm, filled with music and worship. On Christmas morning the Chase family hosted a breakfast in the fellowship hall, followed by a Christmas hymn sing and a message from Pete.

Board of Elders Report

This year a highlight for the elders has been three men (Eric Chase, Al Fish and Chris Howell) who have been willing to investigate the ministry of eldership. We are reading together the book <u>Biblical Eldership</u>: An <u>Urgent Call to Restore Biblical Church Leadership</u>. We meet on the first and third Sundays from 8:00-9:00 a.m. This time is rich, engaging, and really hard to keep to an hour.

Elders "keep watch over the souls" (Hebrews 13:17) of the flock. Elders are the pastors of FBC (Acts 20:28; 1 Peter 5:2). Our desire is to practice "authentic biblical eldership." We desire to be biblically qualified as shepherds in an ongoing way; constantly sharing and praying with each other about our hearts and our lives. We desire to actively shepherd the entire flock. The elders pray, visit, give counsel, and when necessary, discipline.

Much of what we discuss is confidential and has to do with the condition of our "flock." We pray each week for any and all needs we are aware of. Often we will read over the passage to be preached that morning and comment on it.

I would like to ask the membership to consider disbanding the Capital Improvement Committee. I personally feel the remaining work to be done should be under the oversight of the Trustee Board. Our membership is small in number and it is difficult to find people with time to serve.

The 2016 camping season saw our total number of campers rebound from our lower transitional year between leadership teams. We additionally brought back our Counselor in Training (CIT) and Leadership Development Program (LDP) after a several year hiatus.

During 2016, we tackled several large projects around our beautiful grounds:

- Work on the pond beautification and enlargement project continued, culminating with the
 construction of the Sweet Pavilion built through the generosity of Nellie Sweet and others in
 memory of Charlie "Gene" Sweet. The pond itself was deepened, enlarged, and improved as
 well. Additional parking was added at the pond. Looking forward to 2017, we intend to build a
 boat dock, and install playground equipment donated by the new owner of the former
 Rushford school.
- The Vrooman Cabin was completed in time for our camping season. This attractive building
 was made possible through the generous donations of the families of Rita Vrooman and
 Walter Dudley, among others. Some final gradework and a few other finishing touches will be
 completed in 2017.
- The chapel was improved with new benches and 12-foot log cross.
- The existing four-square courts were removed and replaced with a new concrete court.
- New concrete pads were poured at the bathhouse and two of the lodge entrances.
- Various painting projects took place in the lodge and around the grounds.
- A building site was cleared and leveled for an eventual replacement for the green cabin.
- The running gear for our hayride wagon was overhauled for a smoother, sturdier ride.

Along with our annual Dessert Auction in February and Chicken BBQ in April, we again ran a pizza and promotional booth at the Maple Festival. We also included our hay wagon with staff and campers in the Maple Festival parade. This year's fundraiser revealed the need for us to invest on our own larger pizza oven. We had previously used a borrowed two-deck oven. We are now the proud owners of a four-deck oven that will allow us to keep up with the demand for our delicious pies!

The camping season was from July 6th through the 29th. We first had Lil' Squirts day camp for Pre-K through 3rd graders. Our theme was "Jesus is the Light of the World". Campers had fun singing songs, memorizing scripture, going on scavenger hunts, playing ga-ga ball, relay races, games, crafts, swim time, and snack time. A theme song all throughout camp was "My Lighthouse" by Rend Collective, as we focused on how Jesus is our light, and how we should take the light we have and shine it for all to see.

During Discovery, Teen, and Adventure Camps, we studied the book of John using the Lifebook published by The Gideons International. Campers learned from this unique curriculum during morning devotions, Discovery Group, Campfire, and cabin devotion times, and most of all, learned how to give their faith away. They were challenged to take and give away as many Lifebooks as they could to their friends and fellow students during the upcoming school year.

We hired six counselors this year: Jared Finch, Austin Vincent, David Weaver, Carolyn Duttweiler, Megan Jones, and Shelby Skinner. Our CITs were Connor Burrell, Drew Jackson, Shannon Brown, Sophia Lynch, and Amy O'Neal. The CITs participated in a two-week program where, while being campers during Teen Camp, they had daily training sessions in being Christian leaders among their peers in the Leadership Development Program. They returned the following week for Discovery Camp where they assisted and were mentored by the cabin counselors in leading the elementary age group while continuing their LDP sessions. We saw the mutual benefits of this for the CITs, counselors, and campers alike.

During the fall, the Houghton College men's baseball team once again joined us for a workday. We appreciated the work, and their coaches appreciated the free workout program for the team.

During 2016, we had ten different groups/families rent Camp JYC, which greatly helps offset some of our operating expenses. We have three new prospective rental groups already for 2017, with two possible full-week rentals!

We have several pressing needs as we move forward into the 2017 season:

- The log wing of the lodge still needs to be replaced. We have submitted grant requests to several organizations and are awaiting responses.
- The pool liner needs to be replaced and several repairs and maintenance items need to be addressed. We will be seeking funds towards this project in the days to come.
- Many of our picnic tables have reached the end of their usable lifespan. We are currently holding the Adopt a Table fundraiser at the cost of \$200 a table for the purchase of galvanized metal-framed, pressure-treated lumber tables.
