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Pastor's Report

It is a great privilege to be a pastor/teacher/elder at FBC. I can remember when I "set my heart to be an elder" (1 Timothy 3:1) at Eastern Hills Bible Church some time in 1981. We have sojourned together for thirteen years now. This has been the longest I have lived or worked anywhere in my life. Roots are good. Jeremiah 17:8 says, "He will be like a tree planted by the water that sends out its roots by the stream. It does not fear when heat comes; its leaves are always green. It has no worries in a year of drought and never fails to bear fruit."

Preaching continues to be a great joy/challenge and opportunity to learn. We started out the year with a series on the Psalms of Ascent, Psalms 120-134. These Psalms were sung/ recited as the pilgrims traveled up to Jerusalem for the Passover. We then finished up the book of Mark, a series I had started last fall, taking up at the crucifixion through the ascension. Then we started a series in both 1 & 2 Thessalonians. This series was prompted by the prediction that the rapture would happen on May 21, which it did not. In the fall we started on a series through Exodus. We will finish Exodus in February and then start a series through Galatians. I am so grateful for God's Word and the responsibility I have to preach "the whole counsel of God". I have been learning new ways of communicating the sermons on my Mac computers. I receive training in using the computer about twice a month. I love trying to be creative and this training is really pushing my "creative" button. I am grateful for Jen and Molly who 'plus' my creativity.

Teaching is another joy/challenge. The men's Sunday School Class is a great blessing to be a part of. In the winter/spring of '11 we studied Proverbs. The book is a literal gold mine of wisdom. After the summer off, which we all wished didn't happen, we began a study on the Life of David. This study began in 1 Samuel and will encompass the books of 1 & 2 Samuel, 1 & 2 Kings and selected Psalms. There is always room in this class for more men and you can just jump in with us where we are.

In May a group I led finished a two year study of the Bible called 66 Love Letters. We read a book about Bible study and then read every book of the Bible, one at a time, one week at a time. The pace was demanding but the journey was rewarding.

In September I started a group called Good Book of the Month Club. This group is also reading through the Bible together but at a much slower pace, one book a month. This process will take six years to finish. There are 20 participants and many have never read through the entire Bible. It is devotional in nature with the participants sharing what God has taught them that month in the particular book we are in.

My Franklinville Central School involvement was brisk this past year. I coached the boys modified basketball teams, 7th and 8th grades. I also coached the Jr. High cross country team and the girls modified basketball teams, 7th and 8th grades. I also substitute teach about 2-3 times a month, primarily in Physical Education. While the time commitment is demanding I so enjoy the natural contact with so many who don't know Jesus. It is a privilege to represent Jesus to them and live out the gospel alongside them. I also enjoy the contact with the administration/staff and faculty of the

school system. In 1973 I remember desiring to be an influence for Christ in a public school setting. It is such an honor to be realizing that dream.

As I reflect on the year and our fellowship I am most excited about the number of the flock that are actively involved in ministry. If this church depended on me for its ministry we would all be worn out (Exodus 18). Ephesians 4:11-12 is about "equipping the saints for the work of the ministry". I love being involved with a group of saints who are doing ministry.

A theme verse/thought that stirs me for this next year is Hosea 6:3a, "Oh, that we might know the Lord! Let us press on to know him."

Church services were held as follows:

The Jr.-Sr. High Youth Group met regularly on Sunday's at 6:00pm starting in September with our youth leaders Carol and Joey Farrand. Adult Bible Study was held on Wednesday nights at 7:00pm, led by Stu & Amy Burton. Rainbow Club for grades K-3 met on Thursdays from 6:00-7:00 pm with Marie Bargy taking over as leader in March. Other small groups met during the year. The Elders, Deaconesses, Trustees, and Christian Education Boards met regularly. Other committees met as necessary. An Elder's meeting was held on Sunday mornings and led by Peter Spear from 8:00-9:00am. Elementary Camp was July 10th – 15th. Middle School Camp was held July 17th – 22nd. Rec-N-Hob was held July 24th – 29th. The Camp Director was Amy Burton. The Food Pantry, coordinated by Nellie Sweet and staffed by volunteers, was open the 1st & 3rd Wednesdays of each month. We also had the Clothes Closet ministry on those days with Kym Lewis as the head coordinator. Along with the Food Pantry and Clothes Closet, a free Soup Kitchen was offered the 1st and 3rd Wednesday of each month, except during the summer months. Sandy Burton headed this up. We also have an ongoing Shut-in Ministry led by Pat Wright. Pat and Donna Frederick take iPods or CDs, a bulletin from the worship service, and a "Home Touch Newsletter" to the shut-ins. There are alternate ladies that go when Pat is not available.

Deep Transformation of the human personality where no one walks alone, and every hungry person who longs to encounter God and enjoy community can find a mature guide for the journey.

Trustees Report 2010

Board members this year were Tom Songster, Ed Griffin, Rosie Higgins, Al Fish, Judy Forward, Randy Hatch and Bill Steffenhagen.

"The trustees shall hold in trust all property of the church and shall be responsible for the upkeep and management of the same."

The trustees, along with help from the Lord, have been active this year.

Major projects along with many small projects were accomplished. Many of those projects along with the 2012 itinerary are as follows:

Year 2011 started with some excitement when a water line connected to the hot water tank, located in the furnace room, froze and burst apart flooding the fellowship hall. Repair was accomplished and a new power vent was installed to prevent cold air from getting in from outdoors to the water lines. At the same time, it was determined that one of the furnaces located in the furnace room, had a bad heat exchanger which had to be replaced.

The sanctuary was painted during the summer. This included all areas adjoining the sanctuary. A new sound booth was designed and installed by some very handy members of our congregation.

A new sidewalk was installed on the Franklin Street side of the church. The sidewalk project was a joint effort between the church and the village.

The stained glass ventilators located on the Franklin Street side of the sanctuary became a safety issue and the church decided they had to be replaced. The repair included four ventilators, releading and repair of damaged stained glass windows located at other areas.

Thanks to people within our church and some outside help, the water problem in our parking area seems resolved. An installed dry well will save the church from having to install an expensive catch basin.

Much needed rain gutters were installed around the church where needed. This will help keep ground water out of the fellowship hall and the food pantry.

The First Baptist Church sign, located in front of the church, was raised up for better visibility and then painted.

Lights located on each side of the front double doors are now set on sensors to come on at night to give the front of the church more lighting. A new motion light was installed at the back door. A switch located just inside of said back doors controls the motion light and an overhead flood light. This allows for more lighting in the back parking area. Outside lights on the south side of the church were updated and are now working.

Door vents were installed in the food pantry and the storage area where the food pantry produce is kept.

The trustees had two productive church work days this year, one held during early summer and the second during the fall. Many maintenance and fix-up projects were accomplished. A great time of fellowship was had by all.

There are many trustee projects lined up for 2012. The two biggest projects are installing a handicap lift and the carpeting of the sanctuary. Installation of a light pole in the back parking area has also been discussed. The handicap lift and carpeting would of course, have priority. With help from our Lord, these objectives will be realized.

A big thanks to Mit and Barb Farrington for the great job of taking care of the inside of the church and keeping the trustees informed of needed repairs. Thanks to the Hatch family for taking care of the church grounds and to Trent Dingman for shoveling. Things are being discussed in regards to adding more to the already beautiful church frontage. Whenever our church requires electrical work, Ed Griffin responds. There are so many wonderful people within our congregation who have helped take care of our house of worship in past years and the year 2011. It would be difficult to list all of their names. The Lord knows who they are as they are all trustees for our church.

2011 was a great year. As a church, we look forward to 2012 to conduct the work of the Lord in an effective and efficient manner.
