Church services were held as follows:

Jan – June; Sept – Dec – Sunday School @ 9:30 am; Worship @ 10:45 am July & August – No Sunday School and Worship @ 9:45 am

Communion was served the first Sunday of each month with a dinner held after church on most Communion Sundays. The Jr.-Sr. High Youth Group met regularly on Sunday's at 6:00pm starting in September with our youth leaders Carol and Joey Farrand. Adult Bible Study was held on Wednesday nights from 7:00-8:00pm. Rainbow Club for grades K-3 met on Thursdays from 6:00-7:00 pm with Cindy Schwedt as leader. The Elders, Deaconesses, Trustees, and Christian Education Boards met regularly. Other committees met as necessary. An Elder's meeting was held on Sunday mornings and led by Peter Spear from 7:30-8:30 am. Elementary Camp was July 11th – 16th. Middle School Camp was held July 18th – 23rd. Rec-N-Hob was held July 25th – 30th. The Camp Director was Amy Burton. The Food Pantry, coordinated by Nellie Sweet and staffed by volunteers, was open the 1st & 3rd Wednesdays of each month. We also had the Clothes Closet ministry with Kym Lewis as the head coordinator. Along with the Food Pantry and Clothes Closet, a free Soup Kitchen was offered the 1st and 3rd Wednesday of each month, except during the summer months. We also have an ongoing Shut-in Ministry led by Pat Wright. Pat and Donna Frederick take iPods or CDs, a bulletin from the worship service, and a "Home Touch Newsletter" to the shut-ins.

<u>JANUARY</u> – The Fellowship Hall fund began the year at \$77,471.98. The Annual Meeting and potluck dinner was held January 17th after the morning Worship service.

<u>FEBRUARY</u> – Our annual Valentine Banquet was held on Feb. 13 for the adults of our church. Our Youth Group enjoyed Snow Camp on Feb 19-20 and the annual Dessert Auction to benefit Camp JYC was held Feb 27. Many calories were purchased, consumed and taken home for later! Around \$1600 was raised to benefit Camp! Praise the Lord!

<u>MARCH</u> –On March 5, Camp JYC held a gym night at the Franklinville Elementary School for 2009 campers and their friends. Also on March 5, Cassie Hatch started a MOPS (Mothers of PreSchoolers) group. Trustees Report 2010

Board members this year were Tom Songster, Nancy Pfeiffer, Ed Griffin, Rosie Higgins, Randy Hatch and Bill Steffenhagen. Note: Nancy Pfeiffer resigned due to health reasons.

"The trustees shall hold in trust all property of the church and shall be responsible for the upkeep and management of the same."

The trustees, along with help from the Lord, have been active this year. Many small projects along with major projects were accomplished. Many of those projects along with the 2011 itinerary are as follows:

The year 2010 certainly started with a bang! A four person committee was organized to coordinate the removal of the Franklin Street rental property and the subsequent enlarging of the church parking area. Those four people were Bill Schuyler, Tom Songster, Al Fish and Bill Steffenhagen. The Lord's help was felt, as the house salvage work and consequent house removal was accomplished without any setbacks, all done by April. The parking lot enlargement soon followed. Bill Schuyler did a tremendous job coordinating the salvage work and house removal, while Tom Songster used his expertise to layout the parking area. As said, due to help from the Lord, it was a huge success.

A new door was installed at the back of the church. Handicap signs along with parking signs were added. The new parking area was landscaped and grass seed planted. A special door was installed between the kitchen and fellowship hall to help make more room for Sunday School classes. New storm windows were installed at both South Main and Franklin Street sides of the sanctuary. New electrical fixtures were installed for the Food Pantry. Needed work was done to the women's restroom. Two sinks in the kitchen had faucet and plumbing repairs.

A clothing drop facility was set up on church property to help take care of used clothing for the needy. The ongoing problem with light bulb replacement for the hanging light fixtures located in the sanctuary and balcony, appear to be resolved. This had been a problem that seemed to have no solution. With help from the Lord and individuals within the church, said light fixtures can stay as is or be replaced when needed.

The trustees had two productive work days this year. One work day was held during the early part of the summer and the second, during the fall. Along with trustees and volunteer help from the church, many maintenance and fix-up projects were accomplished. A great time of fellowship was had by all.

There are many trustee projects lined up for 2011. Painting and carpeting the sanctuary are strongly considered. The stained glass windows located on the Franklin Street side of the sanctuary are in need of major repair. This was discovered during the installation of the storm windows this past fall. A solution to this problem will be presented to the church.

A plan to refurbish the Baptist Church sign located in front of the church is being planned. The sign will be fixed and extended to be more visible. The plan is also to put the outside lights located on each side of the double door, located at the front of the church, on a timer to provide more light during evening hours. Also, the illumination of the stained glass at the front of the church is being worked on.

A jointly funded effort between the First Baptist Church and the Village of Franklinville towards sidewalk replacement at the Franklin Street side of the church will take place in 2011. There are other projects being discussed that will be brought before the church at a later date. Lots of prayers are needed.

A big thank you to Mit and Barb Farrington for the great job of taking care of both inside and outside of the church, plus keeping the trustees aware of needed repairs. Please be sure and thank them for all that they do.

2010 was a great year. As a church, we look forward to 2011 to conduct the work of the Lord in an effective and efficient manner.
