Pastor's Report 2009

I am finishing my 11th year as pastor of FBC. I've never lived 11 years in one place during my life. I thought I was closing in on Larry Wager's tenure, but he was here from 1/7/62-8/31/74 (12 years, 7 months) so I've got a ways to go to capture the longest tenure award. I figure I've preached at least 500 sermons at FBC. I wonder if there's a 1,000 sermons club?

This year was definitely highlighted by the sabbatical I was granted. During the month of June I traveled, studied, read, played my guitar, spent time with a fellow pastor and just had a total break from the rigors of pastoral ministry. It was a great month for me. Thank you for your generosity and kindness.

This year I finished moderating the Bible Training Center for Leaders curriculum; five years, ten modules, and four students. Because I love teaching in a small group setting I started a new curriculum that I created myself. We studied "How to Study the Bible" in the fall with six students. In the future we will have a year-long Old Testament Survey (10), a half-year New Testament Survey (11) and a half-year class on teaching the Bible (11). The course will continue with a year-long study on Theology (12). The course will conclude with a half-year course on Spiritual Friendship (counseling) (13).

This year I also led a small group study on the book *Shattered Dreams* by Dr. Larry Crabb. I learned that having two mid-week small group studies on top of coaching and other responsibilities was too much.

I coached varsity and jr. high boys cross country, and boys and girls jr. high basketball. I do enjoy the exposure to the students, parents, and the sports community.

I continue to serve on the board of Hands Across the Pacific. We have one missionary couple in Cambodia right now and a single woman is in Cambodia for three months discerning if serving with HAP is for her.

Our daughter Erin and her husband Jeremy and their two boys Ayden and Ethan moved from Houston to Wellsville. It is so good to have them nearby.

Starting in January 2010 I will be preaching from the book of Ephesians. I am looking forward to that series.

This fall I have been teaching a men's Sunday School class. We studied about six weeks on what the Bible says about maleness and femaleness and now we are studying the book *Biblical Deacons: Ministers of Mercy*. I truly enjoy sitting around a table with twelve men and seeking God together.

It truly is a privilege to be a fellow participant in the ministry of FBC.

Church services were held as follows:

Communion was served the first Sunday of each month with a dinner held after church on most Communion Sundays. The Jr.-Sr. High Youth Group met regularly on Sunday's at 6:00pm starting in September with our youth leaders Carol and Joey Farrand. Amy & Stu Burton held a Youth Bible Study at their house from October-present starting on Thursdays and then moving to Sundays after Youth Group. Rainbow Club for grades K-3 met on Thursdays from 6:00-7:00 pm with Cindy Schwedt as leader. The Elders, Deaconesses, Trustees, and Christian Education Boards met regularly. Other committees met as necessary. An Elder's meeting was held on Sunday mornings and led by Peter Spear from 7:30-8:30 am. Counselors-in-training/Elementary Camp was July 12th – 17th. Middle School Camp was held July 19th – 24th. Rec-N-Hob was held July 26th – 31st. The Camp Director was Amy Burton, assisted by Denise Cornell. The Food Pantry, coordinated by Nellie Sweet and staffed by volunteers, was open the 1st & 3rd Wednesdays of each month. We also had the Clothes Closet ministry with Kym Lewis as the head coordinator. Along with the Food Pantry and Clothes Closet, a Free Soup Kitchen was offered the 1st and 3rd Wednesday of each month, except during the summer months. Coordinators were Sandy Burton and Bessie Burroughs. We also have an ongoing Shut-in Ministry led by Pat Wright. Pat takes a tape, a bulletin from the worship service, and a "Home Touch Newsletter" to the shut-ins. There are alternate ladies that go when Pat is not available.

Throughout the year different fundraisers were held for the New Fellowship Hall Fund including a cookbook sale, puzzle sale and a cinnamon roll sale.

<u>JANUARY</u> – The Fellowship Hall Fund started the year at \$61,557. On January 18th, our Annual Meeting and potluck dinner were held following the morning Worship service. 4 couples enjoyed an evening of ballroom dancing in the fellowship hall on January 31st.

<u>FEBRUARY</u> – On February 7 the adults of our church enjoyed a Valentine Banquet in the fellowship hall. Rainbow Club held a sledding party at the church on February 19th and the Youth Group held a Snow Camp at Camp JYC February 20-21. Many attended the annual Dessert Auction and Spaghetti Dinner on February 21to benefit Camp JYC. Stu Burton once again used his unique auctioneering style to coax participants into buying up all of the delicious donations! \$1464.99 was raised for Camp JYC! Praise The Lord!!

<u>MARCH</u> – Ladies attended a Bridal shower for Kimberly Dominessy on March 15. Many couples attended the movie "Fireproof" held in the sanctuary at FBC on the 21st. Camp JYC sponsored its annual Chicken BBQ on March 28. Once again, it was a sell out! A total of \$1027.25 was raised for Camp JYC!

<u>APRIL</u>—On Palm Sunday, April 5, Carol Farrand directed the adult Easter Musical, "Believe." Easter Sunday, April 12, FBC hosted breakfast following the "Sonrise" Service in the park. Several work days were held this month to prepare Camp JYC for the summer.

<u>MAY</u>—Our annual Mother's Day breakfast was held on May 10th and again was prepared by the men of the church.

<u>JUNE</u> – June was a busy month at FBC. The Ladies held a retreat June 5-6 at the Microtel in Springville. The CE Board put on a Mini VBS on June 7 & 14 for the Sunday School kids up to grade 5. June 13 was the church work day coordinated by the trustees of the church. Our annual Road Rally was held on June 20 and enjoyed by many adults. Only a small amount of cheating took place! The CE Board put on the annual Father's Day brunch

on June 21st with many ladies helping to prepare the meal. On June 28, FBC held its worship service up at Camp JYC, our annual "Camp Sunday," and a special offering was taken for camp scholarships.

<u>JULY</u> – We held our three weeks of Camp JYC this month. Countless staff members, volunteers, and campers enjoyed the fun and fellowship as well as the opportunity to learn and grow in the love and grace of our Lord. Several decisions were made for Christ this summer as well as other decisions to study and serve more faithfully. Elementary camp ran from the 12th to the 17th. Middle School week went from the 19th to the 24th, highlighted with a Jonny Diaz concert at the church Tuesday night. Rec-N-Hob week, always a camper favorite, was held the 26-31st. In addition to camp, on July 26, the church voted on and approved the Building Committee's new proposal for a New Fellowship Hall.

<u>AUGUST</u>—A money shower was held for Joanne Tanner for her upcoming wedding. On August 16th, a brief congregational meeting was held to vote on the Missions Holding Fund. It was approved.

FBC families once again participated in ringing the bell for the Salvation Army on December 18 & 19. On December 20, the kids of FBC, under the directorship of Carol Farrand, presented their annual Christmas musical, "Christmas Hang-Ups." A "Happy Birthday, Jesus" party was held in the fellowship hall after the musical. We had our Christmas Eve Service on Thursday, the 24th. It was a wonderful time of music, message and fellowship as we celebrated the birth of our Lord.

The Fellowship Hall Fund ended the year at \$77,471.98.

In the final chapter of Strauch's book he describes the relationship between elders and the congregation. The New Testament is absolutely clear, however, that Christlike love, humility, and prayer are to guide all our relationships and all our deliberations."

It is our prayer as an elder council that we would lead with "integrity of heart and skillfulness of hands" and that the congregation would "follow us as we follow Christ."

Trustees Report 2009

Board members this year were Tom Songster, Nancy Pfeiffer, Ed Griffin, Rosie Higgins, Randy Hatch and Bill Steffenhagen.

"The trustees shall hold in trust all property of the church and shall be responsible for the upkeep and management of the same."

The trustees, along with help from the Lord, have been active this year. Many small projects along with some major projects were accomplished. Many of those projects and the 2010 itinerary are as follows:

After the furnace scare we had in the fall of 2008, when the furnace that services the fellowship hall broke down, it was decided by all concerned to implement a yearly preventative maintenance program for the four furnaces that service our church. This program was started last January and proved itself to be cost effective with the church heating bills. The maintenance program also helped to resolve the ongoing lack of heat problem in the church library. The new digital thermostat installed in the fellowship hall proved to be less complicated and just as efficient as the computerized thermostat it replaced. Consequently, the computerized thermostat located in the nursery was also replaced with a digital one.

Furnace related repair projects somewhat plagued the trustees this past winter. Furnace exhaust piping located at the South Main Street property developed a longitudinal crack and was leaking exhaust fumes into the apartment and the church offices. The whole pipe line was determined to be bad and was replaced.

New energy efficient fluorescent lights were installed in Pastor's office and the same building upstairs Sunday classroom.

A new overhead fan switch for the sanctuary fans was installed in the sound booth. A new projector light was installed along with a thorough cleaning of said projector. Light switches, for convenience, were relocated from the stage area to the sound booth. A big thank you goes out to Ed Griffin for his expertise and help with the electrical work.

Two trees, one dead and the other leaning precariously over the South Main rental property garage, were determined to be nuisances and were removed.

With help from the Lord and dedicated people from our church, the new double door was installed to the Main Street entrance of our church.

New windows were installed in both Sunday classrooms located off the balcony area. Storm windows, for the south side sanctuary windows, were ordered and will be installed as soon as possible.

The trustees had a productive work day in June. Along with trustees and volunteer help from the church, many "fix-up" projects were accomplished. A great day of fellowship was had by all, plus Bessie's cookies and Jim Pfeiffer's coffee certainly helped.

There are many trustee projects lined up for 2010. The money has been approved for replacing overhead lighting in the sanctuary. This will happen when existing lighting fails. Painting and new carpet for the sanctuary is still being considered. Lighting for the stained glass in the front of the church is being considered. A new door for the back entrance to the church is also being considered. Plans are in progress, to be coordinated between all concerned, for the removal of the Franklin Street rental property and consequently enlarging the church parking area. Lots of prayers are needed.

Mit and Barb Farrington did their usual excellent job taking care of both the inside and outside of the church, plus keeping the trustees aware of needed repairs. A big thank you goes out to them.

2009 was a good year. As a church, we look forward to 2010 to conduct the work of the Lord in an effective and efficient manner.

Missions Report 2009

The Missions Board has had another full year! The members meet at least once a month to prayerfully consider how we can best direct our support to those who spread the Gospel and tell others about the Lord. Our members are as follows: Judy Forward, Vonnie Schuyler, Lucy Griffin, Ida Gardner, Pauline Fox, Diana Keller, Secretary and Janice Dominessy, Chairman.

As I review the minutes from each month, it comes to my mind just how much has been accomplished this year. It's truly amazing, when you look at the line items on our budget, how many organizations and missionaries that our small church is able to help support and how far reaching their voices are!

In addition to our line budget items, we continue to help support Cayce's Charities. In January, Pauline and Larry Fox made a trip to Cayce's in Arkansas and dropped off all the items collected by our church. Pauline and Larry have gone to many lawn sales this year and found incredible bargains. They made a second trip to Cayce's in September with another load of goods and 50 boxes of dry milk purchased by the Missions Board. We also shipped a total of 31 boxes, of various items, to them this year. We decided to give them \$800 to put toward a new roof, which they needed so badly, to keep all of the items they collect dry. They, lovingly, reach out to help so many people!!

This year, we also decided to sponsor a person from another country to go through Seminary training, which is a five year course at the cost of \$200. (BTCP Program- Bible Training Center for Pastors)

In March we had a very pleasant "meet and greet" with Joel and Kerri Lord. A love gift was given to them at that time. In May, we gave them a onetime gift of \$500.

A onetime gift, of \$300 each, was also given to the Edwards, Simones, Manns, Damons, Browns, Goldes, and \$400 each to Sayres and HAP. The \$100 extra is to help Luen with her need for a glass eye and Waige in building a new home for her family. We have also given other love gifts to various ministries.

The Missions Board, once again, was happy to help Dick Donovan with a total of \$500 for his prison out-reach ministry.

In November we met with Martin Hatch to discuss the needs of his former church in Virginia. As they had a fire in their old church, they needed help to renovate a new building. A group from our church went down to help and needed money for meals, gas and supplies. We gave them \$1100 in support.

Lucy Griffin communicates regularly with Flavio, our adopted child through World Vision. We have decided to send an extra \$100 to be used for him, for whatever his greatest need might be. This is another great out-reach program we support.

This report would not be complete without mentioning the many checks we have received, from a dear person, which help out in so many ways! I would like to say thank you! I would also like to say thank you to our church family for seeing a need and helping us fill it! "God does work in mighty ways!"

There were four large food drives this year.

This has been a bad financial year for many. We lost some clients because of loss of work, and we gained some. The job situation in our area is not good.

My thank you to all who have helped us <u>help those in need.</u> That is why the First Baptist Church has a Food Pantry.
