## 2005 First Baptist Church Highlights

Church services were held as follows:

Jan – June; Sept – Dec – Sunday School @ 9:30 am; Worship @ 10:45 am

July & August – No Sunday School and Worship @ 9:45 am

Communion was served the first Sunday of each month. The Jr-Sr High Youth met regularly on Sundays with Matthew Berryman. Rainbow Club for grades K-3 met on Thursdays from 6:00-7:00 pm with Janine Thompson as leader. Seekers for grades 4-6 met each Wednesday from 3:15-4:45 pm with Pauline Guckert as leader. Allan Fish led an adult Bible Study on Wednesday nights, studying Genesis. On Tuesdays at 10:00 am, a Ladies Morning Bible study was led by Sue Hughes. An Adult Home Group was lead & hosted by Amy & Stu Burton where Chip Ingram's book "Effective Parenting in a Defective World" was studied. The Christian Proactive Seniors meetings were held on Monday's at Noon each month. The Elders, Deaconesses, Trustees, and Christian Education Boards met monthly. Other committees met as necessary. A Men's Strength Building Class was held on Sunday mornings and led by Peter Spear from 7:30-8:30 am. Women's Fellowship met the 1<sup>st</sup> & 3<sup>rd</sup> Mondays of each month at 7:00 pm. Counselors-in-training/Elementary Camp was July 10<sup>th</sup> – 15<sup>th</sup>. Middle School Camp was held July 17<sup>th</sup> – 22<sup>nd</sup>. Rec-N-Hob was held July 24<sup>th</sup> – 29<sup>th</sup>. The Camp Director was Amy Burton, assisted by Peter Spear. Vacation Bible School was held August 1<sup>st</sup> – 5<sup>th</sup> with Carol Farrand as Director and with "Construction Zone" as the theme. An average of 47 kids attended each day. The Food Pantry, coordinated by Nellie Sweet and staffed by volunteers, was open the 1<sup>st</sup> & 3<sup>rd</sup> Wednesdays of each month. The Clothes Closet, coordinated by Joyce Dickens, was open the 1<sup>st</sup> & 3<sup>rd</sup> Wednesday of each month. Both were open from 10:00 – noon. We also have an ongoing Shut-in Ministry led by Pat Wright and Kay Burton. They take a tape and a bulletin from the worship service to the shut-ins. We also mail a weekly "Home Touch Newsletter" to the shut-ins. There are alternate ladies that go when Pat and Kay are not available.

JANUARY – On January 16<sup>th</sup>, our Annual Meeting and tureen dinner were held following the morning worship service. At this meeting it was voted that the church clerk's responsibilities be rolled into the administrative assistance job responsibilities. It was also voted upon that the Elders be able to adopt policies for the Sexual Abuse Policies. Both passed unanimously. The budget and nominating reports also passed. On January 23<sup>rd</sup>, a reception was held for Agnes Cornell immediately following service. This was held to honor her 15 years of service as the church clerk. On January 23<sup>rd</sup>, a Ladies Tea was held where secret sisters for the past year were revealed and new ones chosen for the coming year.

MARCH – Karl Craft went home to be with the Lord. On March 6<sup>th</sup>, a congregational meeting was held to approve purchase of new Dell Computer & Savin Copier for the office. It was approved with monies to be paid out of the Hansen Fund. A ladies stamping fellowship time was held, lead by Jen Kless. On March 19<sup>th</sup>, a Spaghetti Dinner & Desert auction was held to benefit camp JYC. On March 20<sup>th</sup>, the Impressions Mime Team from Houghton shared during the Sunday School Hour and Coffee Hour followed. On March 27<sup>th</sup> Sunrise Service was held on Crestview Drive with the local ministerium. A breakfast fellowship time was hosted here at FBC with morning worship to follow.

## Board of Christian Education Report 2005

The board members this year were Shelly Broadwell, Dottie Jo Brown, Amy Burton, Ellen Hatch, Laura Kopp, and Janine Thompson. Dottie Jo and Shelly were co-chairmen. Peter Spear was our Elder liaison member.

The board had Sunday School teachers for ages 2 through adults. There was a Men's Group on Sundays at 7:30 a.m. Women's Bible Study met on Tuesday, an Adult Bible Study met on Wednesday evenings, there was an adult class on Monday evenings, and Women's Fellowship met the first and third Mondays of the month. In the fall, we had a Fellowship Time to start the Sunday School Year. Afterwards, the children were introduced to their teachers and children and adults went to their classrooms. During Worship time, all Christian Education Workers were recognized and prayed for. Jacob Thaine, a third grader, was presented with a Bible. At the beginning of Sunday school, 9:30, an Opening was conducted for ages 2 to those in fourth grade. Children worked on memory verses and various songs. In the spring, the children sang for the congregation. In the fall Shelly Broadwell worked on various songs. Joy Caldwell played piano. During Worship, Junior Church was provided for children age 4 through those in grade 4. There were two sections, by age group. In the fall, we had a Church Walk on Halloween. Over 200 people went through the walk. Janine Thompson directed the idea. In the spring, the Houghton Mime Team performed during part of the Sunday School Hour. There was a Coffee and Juice Break, and then the team did skits during part of Worship. On Father's Day, the congregation was invited to breakfast. During Worship, seniors: (high school and college) were recognized and presented with a gift. The classes collected pennies for the Fellowship Hall Fund. Approximately \$250 was collected in the spring. In the fall, our mission project was the Food Pantry. The children's offerings went to the Food Pantry. The Board also gave \$100 to the Food Pantry. Janine Thompson was Rainbow Club leader. Rainbow Club was for kindergarten, grade 1, grade 2, and grade 3. Pauline Guckert was Seekers in Sneakers leader. Seekers were for grades 4, 5, and 6. Pat Wright was the Church Librarian. Carol Farrand was Vacation Bible School Director. On December 18, the Christmas Program was presented. It was a wonderful musical, *Operation Christmas Child*. Carol Farrand was the director. A time of refreshment followed with a birthday cake for Jesus.

Heading this group is a challenge but it's also a tremendous joy and blessing. I enjoy watching God work in and through this ministry. It's a great honor to serve Jesus. Many activities took place this year to benefit Camp JYC both financially and physically. On March 19th a Dessert Auction was held and \$900 were raised.
