Seekers in Sneakers meets on Wednesday's from 2:45-4:45 pm after school in the fellowship hall. From January to June we saw 34 different children, with 10-18 attending weekly. Our Bible lessons and activities center on a month long theme. We learn how to relate the Bible to present day situations. We may learn through lessons, games, videos, a special guest or other activities. "Super Snack" time teaches us God's provisions. Some highlights throughout the year: we made cards and gifts for the shut-ins, held several "fundays", made Easter baskets for families of Olean's Genesis House, closed out June with our annual pizza party and fireworks at camp; many Seekers attended Camp JYC in July.

September we resumed meeting with our "Kick-off Cookout." So far we have seen 33 different children and our weekly attendance has been 11-24. We once again participated in "Operation Christmas Child" and we assembled 81 shoeboxes (6 from Seekers) and made Christmas gifts for Shut-ins.

We've seen 2 children receive Jesus this year; Kristen Tascone remains our faithful assistant. Several teenagers are our helpers. Our on going pop can/bottle collection is very successful for generating extra funds.

Our Prayer Warriors have a tremendous impact on this Ministry and we couldn't go forth without them behind us. I appreciate the wonderful support and encouraging words from the Church family. Heading this group is a challenge but it is also a tremendous joy and blessing. I enjoy watching God work in and through this ministry. It is a great honor to serve Jesus, may all we do at Seekers bring honor and glory to Him!

In December we met on movie day and watched a couple of Christmas shows with a snack. I had brought in all the kids some gifts and passed them out the week of Christmas at Rainbow Club. It was a lot of fun and I think the kids enjoyed it. We made a "Manger Scene" to hang up and read from the Bible on how Jesus was born and the Christmas Story. That's how it has been going so far. The kids that usually come regularly are Damon, Billy, Hanna, David, Taigan and Krissy. Sometimes Dylan, Issac and Ally. We even had Austin and Jacob back in September. Again, I say it's been going very well. I have been providing all the snacks and drinks each week. One week I was given cookies to take by a neighbor. And one week Stephanie Parry provided a fruit snack, other than that it has been me. I don't bother giving you a bill for this-it's on me. And everything else I've been bringing in from home eon my own or it's already provided in the Rainbow Club cabinet. No real expenses thus far except for the Christmas gifts this month. Thank you for putting your trust in me for doing Rainbow Club. I love kids and I love doing this very much! Thank you again!

Camp JYC 2006

Several additions or upgrades were made to Camp JYC this year. Some of these include a paint job to the Pink/DonFrancis cabin, repairs made to the steps and door of this cabin, video projector and portable screen, ice machine, chest freezer, large fans for lodge and salad bar. The church and camp will now share an AED machine as well. The ministry team signed a contract with Bradford Forest Products with consultation from Dale Bigham to do logging on Camp JYC property. In July, we were given a check for \$52,785.00. After paying Mr. Bigham a consulting fee we deposited a remainder in a C.D. at Cattaraugus County Bank. The ministry team is currently working on the best plan for this C.D. We are considering many ideas that include repairs, maintenance, upgrades and additions to the camp property and ministry.

We continued to have 3 weeks of Camp JYC this year. On July 9-14 we housed students who had completed grades 2-5. With a Fiesta Theme, many kids enjoyed the blessings of our camp. Middle school students were invited to our 2nd week of Camp, July 16-21. Again the theme was Fiesta and the kids enjoyed singing, fellowshipping and fun activities. Our traditional Rec~N~Hob Camp was held July 23-28 for students in grades 4-11. Many church members help these campers learn life long hobbies.

Outside of our traditional weeks of Camp JYC, we hosted a FBC Family Camp. Several families attend on Saturday, July8. We played games, held Bible study, sang and ate together as God's family. Camp Sunday was then held on July 9th at Camp JYC under the Rich Burton Memorial Pavilion. A love offering was taken for the Campers Scholarship Fund. Camp JYC was the sight for many family reunions and church gatherings.
