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### **Pastor's Report**

I'll use the acrostic PASTOR to summarize 2014.

Preaching - I preached through Romans from January through November. I loved studying and communicating Romans. This was my 28th full book I've preached in the sixteen years here. In 2015 we will be interacting with the book of 1 Samuel. The series title is Greater Than: God's Story is greater than we can imagine.

Administration - Organizing, coordinating, planning, evaluating, discussing, and resolving issues are necessary parts of my day-to-day responsibilities. I am grateful for Cassie Hatch and the various committee chairpersons who do so much of the administration at FBC.

**S**chool - My opportunities to serve at Ten Broeck Academy and Franklinville Central School bring me great joy. My heart's desire is to be a servant who represents Jesus Christ in every relational encounter.

Teaching - The Good Book of the Month Club is now finishing up year 4.5. I so enjoy this group and the dialogue we have about the Word of God. We finished up in December with Romans and will converse about 1 Corinthians in January. The plan is that we will finish in November of 2015, taking five-and-a-half years to read and discuss every book of the Bible. I am now leading the mid-week Bible study. We are studying the gospel of John and started with chapter 13; we will finish John around Easter time. We will then start studying the Psalms, which will be in concert with the preaching series through 1 Samuel.

Outreach - Camp JYC is my biggest outreach ministry with which I am involved. I am still the pool coordinator - clean it, coordinate repairs, oversee the lifeguards, and lifeguard myself. Cleaning the pool takes 8-10 hours a week when the pool is open, from early June through September. I also coordinate the campfire speakers, vespers speakers, and staff devotions. I am also on the grounds crew and try to help with weekly mowing of the acres of lawn. Next to the formal outreach of JYC I am also a member of the Franklinville Church Association. I have been the treasurer for the past ten plus years but was able to pass on that responsibility. This is a good group and I enjoy not only the relationships but the cooperative spirit that exists among our churches. Hands Across the Pacific is still an active entity. I have been on the board since 2000. We have around three board meetings a year, but I meet with Dick Matthews on a regular basis and am now the vice president of the HAP board. The opportunities for ministry in Cambodia and now Laos are seemingly limitless. Wisdom is needed as to where our energies and resources will be most effective.

Relating - My primary relationship is with God. I spend time daily with Him in prayer and His Word. I read books about Him and how to know and serve Him. I have a fellow pastor friend with whom I chat every month for the purpose of spiritual direction. This has proven to be invaluable to me in my walk with God. Molly is still my number one spiritual influence. She speaks to me, challenges me and encourages me unlike anyone else. I continue to meet one-on-one with folks on a weekly basis. I also have multiple, simple chats with folks. While I am busy, I am never too busy to spend time with folks who would like to meet with me.

#### Church services were held as follows:

Jan – June; Sept – Dec – Sunday School @ 9:30 am; Worship @ 10:45 am July & August – No Sunday School, Worship @ 9:45 am

Communion was served the first Sunday of each month. The Jr.-Sr. High Youth Group met regularly on Sunday evenings through the end of the 2013-2014 school year. A new Teen Bible Study was started in November by Denise Cornell. Adult Bible Study was held on Wednesday nights, led by Stu & Amy Burton through August, and then by Pete Spear for the remainder of the year. The Good Book of the Month Club continued to study together. The Elders, Deaconesses, Trustees, and Christian Education Boards met regularly. Committees met as necessary throughout the year. The Men's Breakfasts continued once a month. An Elders' meeting was held on Sunday mornings at 8am. Camp JYC was in session from July 9<sup>th</sup> through August 1<sup>st</sup>, directed by Amy Burton. The Food Pantry, coordinated by Nellie Sweet and staffed by volunteers, was open the 3<sup>rd</sup> Wednesday of each month. The Clothes Closet was opened on those days as well, coordinated by Kym Lewis. We also have an ongoing Shut-in Ministry led by Pat Wright. Pat, Donna Frederick and Dot Songster take iPods, a bulletin from the worship service, and a "Home Touch Newsletter" to the shut-ins.

**January** – The year started with the Fellowship Hall fund at \$193,820. Garrison Jon Cornell was born on the 5<sup>th</sup>. The Annual Meeting was held on the 26<sup>th</sup>.

**February** – Valentine's Banquet was on the 15<sup>th</sup> with a special performance by Dean (Martin) Hatch. Youth Group Snow Camp was 16-18<sup>th</sup>. The Dessert Auction was on the 22<sup>nd</sup> and \$2,272.07 was raised for camp.

*March* – Our annual Progressive Dinner was on the 22<sup>nd</sup>.

*April* – Chicken BBQ to benefit Camp JYC was on the 5<sup>th</sup>. A memorial service for Eloise Gulick was held on the 6<sup>th</sup> followed by ice cream sundaes. FBC hosted Maundy Thursday, Good Friday and Easter Sunday services on the 17<sup>th</sup>, 18<sup>th</sup> and 20<sup>th</sup>.

May - A talent show was held on the  $10^{th}$ , raising \$750 to benefit the Capital Improvement Fund.

**June** – On the 1<sup>st</sup>, the Capital Improvement Fund Committee presented the congregation with a plan to add on to our current building. A bridal shower was given for Samantha Kopp on the 8<sup>th</sup>. On the 15<sup>th</sup>, the congregation voted almost unanimously to move forward with the building plans. Also on the 15<sup>th</sup>, the annual Father's Day breakfast was held in the fellowship hall during the Sunday School hour. Summer hours began on June 29<sup>th</sup>.

**July** – Camp Sunday was on the  $6^{th}$ , followed by lunch at Camp. We had a great camping season, starting on July  $9^{th}$  and ending on August  $1^{st}$ . A clean up crew cleaned the old nursery area on the  $26^{th}$ .

**Aug** – A farewell picnic for the Burtons followed worship at Camp on the 24<sup>th</sup>. FBC hosted the Pioneer Community Band in concert on the 26<sup>th</sup>.

**September** – There was a coffee hour and fellowship time before church on the 7<sup>th</sup> to introduce this year's Sunday School classes. Thursday night rehearsals for the Christmas choir began.

*October* –The Iron Sharpens Iron conference was on the 25<sup>th</sup>, while the Soul Sisters met to pray for the men and to pack boxes for college students.

**November** – The new Teen Bible Study led by Denise Cornell started on the 16<sup>th</sup>. We collected our shoeboxes for Operation Christmas Child on the 16<sup>th</sup> as well. Our annual Harvest Dinner was on the 23<sup>rd</sup>.

**December** – On the 13<sup>th</sup> & 14<sup>th</sup>, a Living Nativity walking tour was performed in parking lot, led by the Free Methodist Church. The Pioneer Community Band returned to perform a Christmas concert on the evening of the 16<sup>th</sup>. The choir performed selections from "More Than Just A Man" on the 21<sup>st</sup> during worship, led by Beth Chase. ### **Trustees Report**

Board members this year were Al Fish, Judy Forward, Randy Hatch, Rosie Higgins, Larry Fox, Tom Songster and Bill Steffenhagen.

"The trustees shall hold in trust all property of the church and shall be responsible for the upkeep and management of the same."

The trustees, along with help from our Lord, have been active this year. There were many repair and upkeep projects that were completed in 2014. Some of said projects started in 2014 will carry over into 2015. Many of the 2014 projects, repairs and church upkeep along with the 2015 itinerary is as follows:

Every spring, all fire extinguishers are checked and upgraded where needed, including those at Camp JYC. Church storm windows are removed and put in storage. Annual fall inspection and maintenance is conducted on the four furnaces along with the two furnaces located in the rental house. The snowplowing contract with Jim Harrington was renewed. Spring parking lot repair and rework, as always, was done by one of our gracious members.

Plumbing work was done in the kitchen. Shelves were installed in the utility room. The lighted cross located over the stage had a short in its wiring and had to be repaired. Emergency lights used for electrical outage were maintained with new batteries and bulbs where needed. One emergency light had to be replaced. Exit lights also had to have new bulbs and one of said lights needed new wiring.

Late 2013 and into 2014, a leaking toilet located in the sanctuary level restroom was moved from its old location allowing us to move drain tile in the utility room away from the concrete wall, which eliminated tile the freeze up that was causing the ongoing problems.

The copy machine and mail access area was relocated to the landing area located just inside the Franklin Street entrance.

The Trustees, with the help of one of our church members, were able to obtain new ceiling fans for the sanctuary. The new fans were purchased at a discount price and are remote controlled. These will replace the old ceiling fans, which have bearing problems.

With the help of gracious members from our church, the work to refurbish the old nursery was started. The plan is to finish this area in 2015.

When possible, wainscoating located in the church sanctuary will be upgraded.

A big thanks to a church member who devoted his time and materials to repair the leaking rental house roof. Bless him for his help.

The church roof is between 25 and 30 years old. Shingles from the south side of the building have been found in the parking lot for at least the last two years. Periodic inspections have been conducted by the appropriate people to make sure the roof does not leak. The

concerns are: due to the age of the existing roofing materials and the damage that a leak could cause to the sanctuary ceiling and the rest of the church, a new roof should be installed in the near future, preferably summer or fall of 2015. The trustees are in the process of getting estimates from reliable contractors, which will be discussed and put before the congregation for approval at the appropriate time.

As usual, a big thanks to Mitt and Barb Farrington for the great job taking care of the inside of the church, and for keeping the trustees informed of needed repairs. A big thanks to the people who make our church so beautiful with the lawn upkeep, flower planting and hedge pruning. Also, thanks to those who keep our sidewalks shoveled during the winter months.

There are so many wonderful people within our church family who have helped take care of our house of worship in both past and present. It would be difficult to list all of their names – the Lord know who they are. They are all trustees for our church.

2014 was another great year. As a church, we look forward to 2015 to conduct the work of the Lord in an effective and efficient manner.

As reported last year, we retained the services of an architect to best utilize our current building and design a new construction plan. During the spring of 2014 the church voted on and approved a three-phased plan for construction. At year-end we are waiting for the Village Planning Board to approve our plan. We have received approval from the Village Zoning Board. In January 2015 we will begin working on the interior of our building to accommodate new construction slated to begin in the spring of 2015.

"Phase One" will consist of a new office and Sunday school addition with handicapped access to an enlarged fellowship hall. "Phase Two" will be completed when funds are available and will focus on drive-up access along with a new gathering area in front of the church. "Phase Three" will add additional rooms.

In November we gave the allotted amount of food plus an extra dinner box and turkey to 89 people.


In December we gave the allotted amount of food plus produce, fruit and a choice of a ham or turkey to 85 people.
