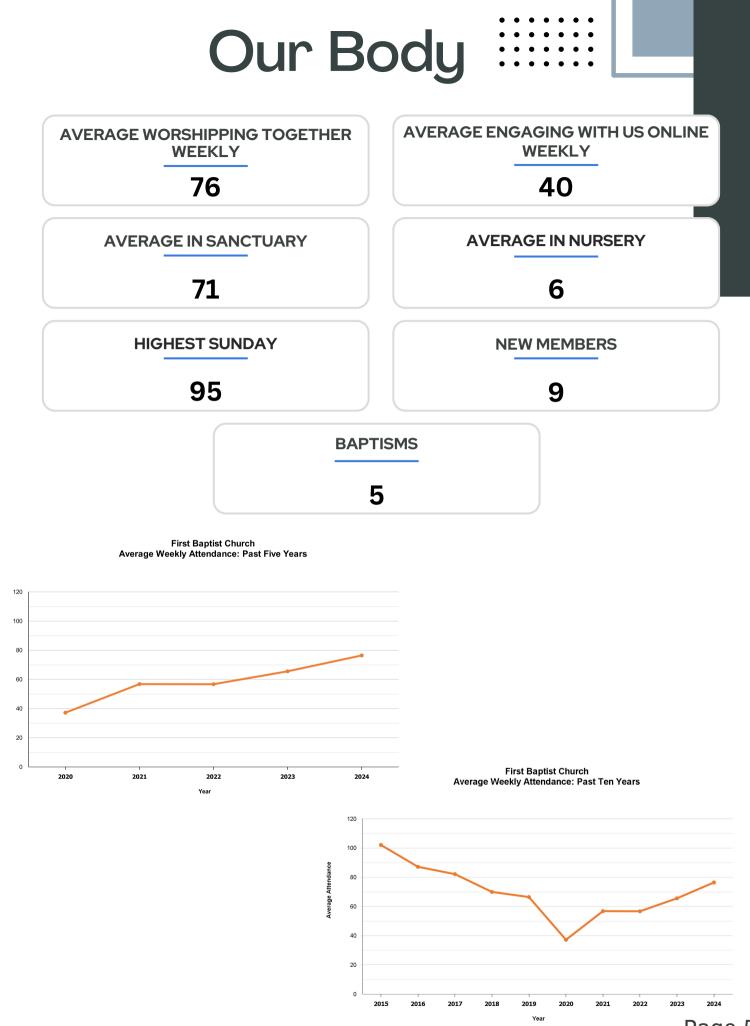

Elders Report

Dear Church Family,

As the elders reflect upon 2024, it is clear to us that each moment of our church's life has been made possible only through God's grace, love, and mercy. Not only did we have the honor of completing another year of ministry, but we are extremely grateful to The Lord for sustaining us for what will be 200 years in Franklinville this October. What an incredible legacy of ministry and worship! While we honor our church's past and rich traditions, we have the burden of looking to the future to ensure we are able to enjoy even more significant milestones. We firmly believe that with God's help, our church's best days are ahead of us, and we pledge to do all we can to be used by God as He brings that about. We must continue to trust The Lord–He has carried us this far, and He holds our individual and collective futures in His hands (Philippians 1:6). The goals for our church remain the same: to be as loving, faithful, and obedient as possible; to seek first the Kingdom of God and His righteousness (Matthew 6:33); and to lead the lost to Christ, disciple the found in Christ, and demonstrate Christ's love by serving our community.

We are blessed to say that 2024 was a year of growth for our church, both numerically and in spiritual depth and discipleship. New individuals and families joined our church in the past year; in doing so, they joined in partnership with us as we pursue the mission and vision God has given us. Eight new members joined by completing the membership class and being affirmed by the elders and the congregation in the spring. Five believers were baptized upon clear testimony of faith in Jesus Christ. Over twenty people decided they wanted to learn how to share their faith more effectively, so they completed the four-session evangelism training, Share Jesus without Fear. Throughout the year, we spent Sunday mornings studying 1 and 2 Thessalonians, the Psalms of Ascent (Psalms 120 through 134), our Church Covenant and the angelic announcements surrounding Jesus' birth.

Additionally, in the last quarter of 2024, the elders prayerfully identified and nominated qualified men to serve as deacons. We are delighted to share these two men are currently undergoing deacon training with the goal of serving in their new ministry as effectively as possible. If The Lord wills, we plan to ordain these men and launch the deacon ministry in the first quarter of 2025. We believe The Lord will use them mightily. In January of 2025, we launched a churchwide Bible study, in which we will be go verse-by-verse through the book of Isaiah. We continued to reach out to the youth in our community through the school year with our youth group, JYC Downtown, which is served well by a group of loving volunteers.

We were blessed to be able to offer a new Sunday school class for young adults, and it has been well-attended. We also added an elder, Mike Goff, and are very grateful for his ministry and leadership. We continue to receive and disseminate prayer requests through our church's prayer chain.

We anticipate The Lord will continue to work in and through FBC in 2025. Our bicentennial celebration will be a major undertaking will require the involvement of all of our church's boards, committees, and ministries. Over the course of this year, the elders plan to take a fresh look at our church's constitution, and to suggest changes wherever necessary. We ask that you pray for us as we begin that effort. We will continue to emphasize local missions and outreach, and we will look to solidify and equip our church's ministries wherever possible, as well as introduce new ministries. Overall, it is our aim to foster and cultivate your close relationships with The Lord, and with one another. We want to encourage you with the Apostle Paul's words to the Thessalonian church:

9 Now concerning brotherly love you have no need for anyone to write to you, for you yourselves have been taught by God to love one another, 10 for that indeed is what you are doing to all the brothers throughout Macedonia. But we urge you, brothers, to do this more and more, 11 and to aspire to live quietly, and to mind your own affairs, and to work with your hands, as we instructed you, 12 so that you may walk properly before outsiders and be dependent on no one (1 Thessalonians 4:9-12, ESV).

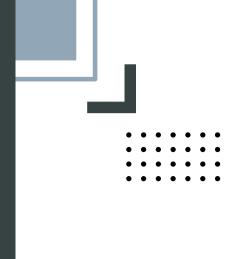

We are also administering the "Acts 2" fund with a beginning balance on 1/1/24 of \$148.10, deposits of \$255.00 throughout the past year, one expenditure of \$2250, resulting in a year-end balance of \$153.10.



Missions Report

As you may remember, the elders are currently serving as our church's missions board. While serving in that capacity, we had previously spent approximately a year and a half in prayer and searching God's Word for His will regarding our church's missions budget. Our goal throughout that process was simple–steward our resources as faithfully as possible and in accordance with God's commands. As our Lord Jesus said in Acts 1:8, But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you, and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the end of the earth.

This commitment led us to reallocate our missions funds, with a much greater emphasis on the Franklinville community, which we view as our local mission field (our Jerusalem), with Camp JYC being our primary outreach ministry. We maintain a commitment to international missions by partnering with the Southern Baptist Convention. Another way we participate in international missions is by continuing to partner directly with missionaries with whom we have an established relationship, both by receiving prayer needs, and taking up periodic love offerings. In 2024, we also began giving to C.H.O.I.C.E.S., a local nonprofit pregnancy resource center and counseling ministry which shares the Gospel message.

In 2024, we took up love offerings for the following individuals and families:

The Mercier family, located in Franklinville Drew and JoAnne, serving in North Africa Trinity of Fairview Church, Fletcher, NC, assisting with hurricane relief Dick Matthews, serving in Cambodia and Taiwan The McLaughlin family, located in Franklinville These offerings are only possible because of your love and generosity, so we are very grateful you chose to participate in them– And he said to him, "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind. 38 This is the great and first commandment. 39 And a second is like it: You shall love your neighbor as yourself. 40 On these two commandments depend all the Law and the Prophets" (Matthew 22:37-40).

As our commitment to missions is unchanged in 2025, our missions budget is likewise unchanged. As in 2024, we will provide the congregation with ample opportunities to give directly to missions through love offerings, and we anticipate taking up an offering at least once per quarter, or as we become aware of specific needs. We also invite you to join us in reaching Franklinville with the Gospel, as we will continue to emphasize local outreach in our church's ministries, and give you opportunities for involvement.

Do you not say, 'There are yet four months, then comes the harvest'? Look, I tell you, lift up your eyes, and see that the fields are white for harvest. 36 Already the one who reaps is receiving wages and gathering fruit for eternal life, so that sower and reaper may rejoice together. 37 For here the saying holds true, 'One sows and another reaps.' 38 I sent you to reap that for which you did not labor. Library Report

With this year's library budget, the library was able to purchase 40 fiction books. It used \$28.26 from the memorial fund to complete the purchases. We had 71 non-fiction books donated. Thank you to all who participate in the library. Many blessings.

Trustees Report

With Christ as our example and with God's word as our guide, our mission as Trustees of Franklinville First Baptist Church is to support the Mission and ministry of the Church by giving oversight to maintenance and care of church properties, by managing fiscal operations of the ministry, by serving as legal custodians, and by promoting the unity of the body of Christ.

In 2024 the trustees were involved in the following projects:

- Approved the purchase of storage cabinets. These were for the newly finished youth room, completing the capital improvement project. We received the Certificate of Occupancy from the local Code Enforcement Officer.
- Repaired a roof leak. It was pointed out that there were water stains in the front foyer near the sanctuary doors. A volunteer offered to make the necessary repairs.
- Wrote and approved a purchasing policy. Purpose: To ensure that Franklinville First Baptist Church (FBC) is a good steward of the funds entrusted to it by enacting proper accountability, direct oversight, and prior authorization for all expenditures, while also ensuring expenses are executed, accounted for, and reimbursed in the most efficient and timely manner.
- Replaced the nursery door. After a request from the Christian Ed. Team, we organized a small in-house team to convert the existing conventional type of nursery door to a "Dutch" style door. This was done to improve security for the children attending and the nursery workers.
- Improvements to the north balcony classroom. A small in-house team replaced the ceiling light and repaired some ceiling damage. Another team cleaned, primed and painted the room. This was in response to the addition of a new young adults Sunday School class.
- Temporarily repaired a drain issue in the kitchen. SWAN reported a plugged sink drain in the kitchen. An in-house team replaced a small section of drainpipe. The same issue was reported a second time and a team responded to address it.
- Countless other small projects were completed by volunteers. Many projects get completed without getting back to the Trustees, including work by other committees and ministries. To anyone involved in any projects not mentioned here, THANK YOU! Your work IS appreciated by the Trustees.

The church building was used by a few groups from the community throughout the year. This year we welcomed SWAN (including a local senior's group), WIC Program, AA, NA, Hatch Music Studio, and Franklinville Central Cross Country and Track teams. Our church also hosted "fall festival" block party in October.

Christian Education Report

The Board once again coordinated Sunday school teachers, curriculum and supplies for students from age two through adults. The Board supports all Bible study and teaching groups, as requests are made.

We hosted a few fellowship breakfasts and coffee hours this year (Mother's Day, Father's Day and SS Opening, on Sept. 8) In June, three students were given Bibles this year: Axel Sage, Paisley Sage and Kaidryn Sage. Four high school graduates: Katie Hatch, Lily Howell, Lucy Marchese, and Sofia Bentley were recognized and given a travel size Bible and devotional book. Sunday school teachers were also recognized and thanked in the spring, with a small gift.

We have been blessed to have a great group of dedicated teachers. Those mentoring our children and youth are Kara Palmisano & Angie Goff, Russ Hatch, and Mark Palmisano & Mike Goff. Leading our adult classes are: Denise Cornell, Nate Cornell, and Anne Fountain (until she moved away in the spring). The ladies in this class have since taken turns leading their study. In the fall we added a young adult class, which is led by Seth and Aubrey Chittum.

The CE Board oversees the nursery attendants. Lucy Marchese and Sofia Bentley continued to serve in our nursery through August, when they both went away to college. Ally Weller continues to care for our little ones, along with Faith Peterson, who started in August. Sarah Lewis is a wonderful addition to our nursery team, always willing to fill in as a substitute when needed. We are so grateful for the care they provide, enabling parents to participate in the worship services.

In the spring, we updated our nursery procedure, to make the nursery a safer place for our children. Along with a new tag system (for the children and their parents,) we had a new locking half door installed. (Thank you to Rick Hatch for creating and installing this door!)

Our SS teachers (and our nursery attendants) were given a small gift at Christmas, to thank them for their dedicated service at FBC. We appreciate all that they do.

On Palm Sunday, the children performed several songs with hand bells. hank you to Amber Malinowski for coordinating this special presentation. In lieu of a Christmas program this year, on the Sunday prior to Christmas, Pastor Mark did a special children's sermon. The kids enjoyed this special time.

Hospitality & Outreach Report

Mission statement: To extend the Gospel, and encourage first the Congregation; then the Community, to Love and Welcome others through Outreach and Fellowship

Ongoing Committee responsibilities:

- Maintaining the upstairs coffee station. This has been well received, and now with the addition of a tea pot, more people can participate and enjoy a time of fellowship.
- Communion observation. In December a list of attendants was set up for the year. Teams of 2 will continue to supply communion for the Lord's Supper.
- Cards of encouragement. We pray over the cards that are sent and take encouragement seriously.
- This committee has also taken on the responsibility of supplying paper products (plates, bowls, cups, plasticware) for church sanctioned functions. This is not a task that was placed upon the committee, but rather the committee saw a need and chose to fill it.
- Overseeing soup nights on the 1st Wednesday of every month during cold weather.

January: Advent decorations were taken down and stored. A new tree was purchased for next year. The Love Thy Neighbor campaign started for the 3rd year.

February: Love Thy Neighbor campaign ended with a breakfast celebration on February 11. A funeral meal was provided for the family of Carol Werner, the committee took every effort to create an atmosphere of comfort.

March: We created "laundry bags" placing a laundry pod, dryer sheet, \$5 laundry mat card and church information in a baggie to be placed on the bulletin board in the laundry mat. 2-3 a week were placed for use for those that needed it. The hope is to allow people to maintain their dignity without having to ask.

April: The committee sponsored a plant party open to other churches, which was well attended by the congregation and community members. Participants enjoyed a meal was prepared by Elizabeth Wares. We donated a basket for the raffle to benefit Rachel's Challenge, a community focused nonprofit who helps organize house and yard repairs for those in need. Committee members also signed up for the Maple Fest pizza booth to benefit Camp JYC.

May: The committee members manned the concession stand for opening day of little league. This freed up parents to be able to watch their children instead of having to work at the booth. Church and camp information was handed out and questions answered.



June: The Hospitality Committee oversaw donations and volunteers to supply the food for TBA's Baccalaureate, which was held at Camp. Families were invited to spend time after the ceremony and explore the grounds. This committee supplied hot dogs, hamburgers, chips, cookies and other snacks. Many were donated by the congregation.

July & August: No activities during these months so committee members can concentrate on helping at Camp JYC.

September: First soup night of the season. Planning started for the annual fall block party held after the trunk or treat in October.

October: The block party was a big success thanks to the support of the whole congregation. An estimate of more than 200 people attended. Simple games, hot dogs, chili, wagon rides, corn mill, apple press, popcorn and so much more were provided. This is a huge event that could not happen without the help of so many willing to volunteer.



November: With Thanksgiving so late the congregation was asked to stay after the harvest dinner and annual meeting to help decorate for Advent. Many stayed to help, many hands made for light work. Thank you. The committee signed and mailed Christmas cards to attendees whose addresses were on file at the time of the mailing.

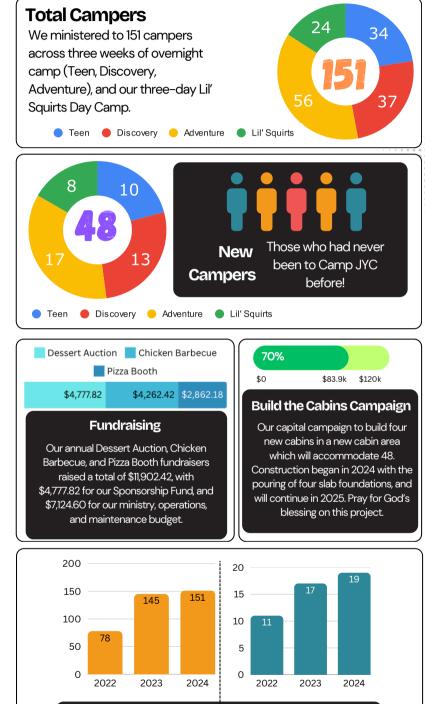

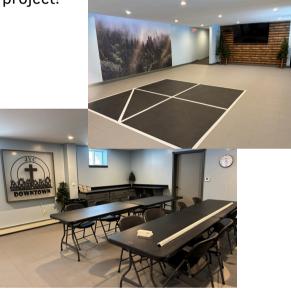
JYC Downtown Report Submitted by Cassie Hatch

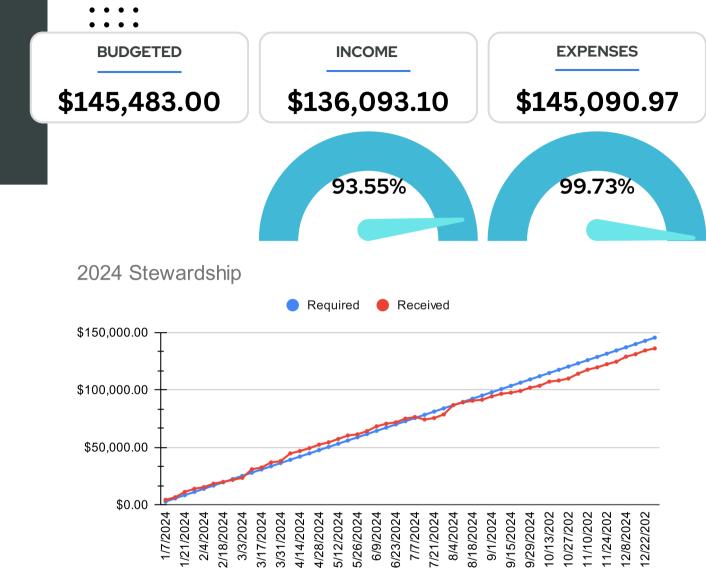

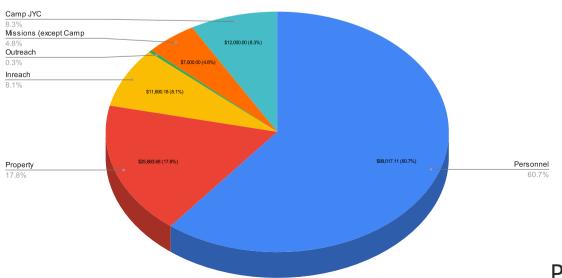
